Holocaust Denial in the Middle East

Arab and other Middle Eastern leaders teach that the Holocaust is nothing more than Israeli propaganda used to undermine the Palestinian-Arab cause. Freedom of the press does not exist in the Arab world, so the population is rarely exposed to the truth about the Holocaust.

The Palestinian-Arab leadership repeatedly denies the Holocaust and teaches its children to do the same.

- Palestinian Authority (PA) President Mahmoud Abbas wrote his dissertation arguing that Zionists collaborated with Nazis to increase Jewish migration to Palestine.ⁱ
- Younis al-Astal, a prominent Hamas-sponsored cleric, stated that **Holocaust** education should be considered a war crime.
- Textbooks used in Palestinian-Arab schools discuss WWII at length, but ignore the systematic extermination of 6 million European Jews.ⁱⁱⁱ
- Fatah leader Hatem Abd al-Qader said that Holocaust education "is a great danger to the developing Palestinian mentality...As for the so-called Holocaust, it has already been moved into the museum of history."
- "When the history of the Holocaust is taught [in Palestinian-Arab schools], it must be explained to the pupils that the Holocaust was significantly inflated and that we...were forced to live with its results." - Dr. Musa Al-Zu'but, Chairman of the Education Committee of the Palestinian Legislative Council
- Professors at Al-Quds University in eastern Jerusalem condemned students who visited Auschwitz in early 2014 for repeating "lies and fabrications" about the Holocaust. The professor who led the trip was later forced to resign after pressure and intimidation from his colleagues. - A PA-funded children's publication published a young girl's essay that glorifies
 Hitler in 2011. Some PA schools regularly quote Hitler and promote the Nazi
 leaders' messages.

Leaders in the rest of the Middle East also deny the Holocaust. Here are just a few examples:

- Following a 2012 UN decision to introduce Holocaust education to Palestinian-Arab children in refugee camps, Jordanian teachers protested, claiming that such studies will undermine the Palestinian-Arab cause.^{ix}
- The Supreme Leader of Iran, Ayatollah Khamenei, said in 2014 that the historic reality of the Holocaust is "unknown" and questioned if it actually occurred.^x
- A leader of Egypt's top secular party (Ahmed Ezz El-Arab) in 2011 called the Holocaust "a lie" and Anne Frank's memoir "a fake." He also said the 9/11 attacks were "made in the USA."xi



 Hassan Nasrallah, head of the Iranian-funded terrorist group Hezbollah, frequently denies the Holocaust and calls for the murder of Jews and the destruction of America and Israel.xii
